Login.gov makes signing in simple with **one email address** and **one password** each time you access your account.

A government-run shared service built for public-sector needs and supported by leading private-sector technologies.

More than 200 federal and state government programs and 180+ million users.

Secure authentication and identity verification offerings that agencies can integrate into their digital services.

Login.gov's Commitments to the American Public

 **Facilitating user access** — Continually expanding the ways users can verify their identity, such as offering [in-person proofing through the U.S. Postal Service](#), and providing 24/7, multilingual support through the [Login.gov Help Center](#).

 **Protecting user data** — Strictly adhering to Federal privacy protections, requiring user consent prior to information being shared, and providing full transparency on how data is managed. Read more on [Login.gov's privacy and security practices](#).

 **Preventing identity fraud** — Offering independently assessed IAL2 identity verification, backed by a dedicated fraud team. View Login.gov on the [Kantara Trust Status List](#).

 **Making efficient use of taxpayer dollars** — Procuring commercial technology centrally, re-using previous verified credentials, and leveraging authoritative government data sources.
